This term we look forward to welcoming Mr Pooler to the team as our new Site Manager. Mr Pooler is looking forward to helping ensure our school.



This half term, Year 4 will be completing their Multiplication Times Tables Check;

In additional, our Year 1 children (and some Year 2 children) will be completing their <a href="Phonic Screen">Phonic Screen</a> during the week commencing Monday 10<sup>th</sup> June.

<u>KS1 SATs</u> are no longer compulsory. However, our Year 2 will be completing the optional tests during June. These tests will replace other assessments that the children would usually complete at the end of each term so will not create any additional assessments. The results of these assessments will provide a useful benchmark as the children prepare to move into KS2.

A reminder that <u>places are limited and allocated on a first come, first serve basis</u> for the half term. Each half term, club places will be reset and allocated again.

Clubs must be booked under 'Clubs' and then paid for via 'Payments' in the Gateway app to secure the place.

A text message will be sent to inform parents when the clubs go live on the Gateway app. Lunchtime clubs do not need to be booked.

#### **Sun Protection**

As the weather becomes warmer (we hope!) we would advise that parents apply an 'all day' sun cream to their child before the start of the day. Please also remember to send your child to school with a sunhat to wear outdoors and a water bottle so that they can keep well hydrated.

Sunglasses can be worn on the playground but must be worn sensibly and should not be worn inside. As with other items, children are responsible for looking after sunglasses etc. Please ensure all items sent into school are clearly named.

Whilst we hope for sun, we also know how unpredictable the good old British weather can be! Please provide your child with a waterproof coat in case of rain!


Our catering manager will be meeting with the school council in the coming weeks to carry out a pupil voice to inform the menu for Autumn 2024.


