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Relationships (& Sex) Education Parents Consultation 2024

Dear Parents/Carers,

At St. Paul's we use **Jigsaw**, 'the mindful approach to PSHE', as our scheme of work to teach PSHE (Personal, Social, Health Education). The programme consists of 6 half-term units, each with 6 lessons. We call these



Jigsaw 'Puzzles'. (Being Me in My World, Celebrating Difference, Dreams and Goals, Healthy Me, Relationships and Changing Me).

Lessons build children's emotional literacy, self-esteem and knowledge of who they are and how they relate to each other and the world, in a positive and healthy way.

Primary schools in England are required to teach Relationships Education, which is embedded throughout the Jigsaw scheme of work. Whilst not compulsory, it is also recommended that all primary schools have a Sex Education programme that is tailored to the age of the pupils to support their ongoing emotional and physical development effectively, as part of preparation and transition to secondary school.

Sex Education should ensure that both boys and girls are prepared for the changes that adolescence brings and, drawing on knowledge of the human life cycle set out in the national curriculum for science, understand how a baby is conceived and born.









Sex Education is defined at St Paul's as; *learning about human reproduction, sexual intercourse, conception, pregnancy and birth.* The focus is reproduction NOT sexual activity.

Parents have the right to withdraw their children from Sex Education.

Looking ahead to next year, we would like to invite you to attend a consultation session at school in which we will give you a transparent and comprehensive picture of what the Jigsaw Scheme of Work suggests we teach, and in which year groups.

We would very much welcome your attendance and feedback, to help us implement the best curriculum for our children from September and inform our updated RSE policy.

To try and meet the needs of all of our parents, we are offering two meeting times, both to be held in the school hall;

Wednesday 10th July @ 2.15pm & Thursday 11th July @ 5.30pm.
